

#### Why you cannot attend either meeting?

February 2, 2006 I am vacationing in Idaho and will not be back in Pittsburgh until February 6.

February 16, 2006 I will be speaking at a conference in Florida

from February 15 to the 18th.

In no way should my absence from these County Council proceedings be construed as a lack of interest in serving on the County Parks Commission.

What are the highlights since you have been on the board of the Parks and Recreation Commission of Allegheny County?

#### The Parks Commission has:

- Facilitated the donation of 14.14 acres of land to South Park at a value of \$250,000 from the Mellon Foundation to the County Park System.
- Financed and enabled the study of comparable "Park Systems of Excellence" located in eight states to explore the common denominators of success.
- Conducted twelve regional Parks Commission Meetings open to the public accepting input for management and needs of the parks. These meetings were in rotating park locations over the past two years.
- Developed a strategy to secure the lead graft of mineral rights to Settler's Cabin Park to enable the Botanic Garden to develop its master plan.
- Secured the venue for the successful flood victim fundraiser concert at Heinz Hall.

- Coordinated a meeting amongst the Council of Friends groups with the Pennsylvania Park and Forest Foundation.
- Provided input and creative thinking on important dilemmas, e.g., dredging of North Park lake
- Assisted the County Executive to identify and review options for a nonprofit fundraising entity
- Provided support and input into extension of the Great Allegheny Passage from McKeesport to Pittsburgh

#### What are your future goals for the Commission?

The Parks Commission hopes to:

- Consider the advantages and disadvantages of consolidating some or even all of the City and County Parks functions to the benefit of both entities and the public who cherishes and uses these invaluable resources; participate in an open dialogue and pros and cons
- Support the new nonprofit County Parks entity to generate additional resources (financial, programmatic, public relations, etc) for strengthening an already strong Parks system
- Review and advance opportunities to connect the County Parks to a robust trail system
- Ensure that the farsighted and highly popular County Parks Strategic Plan continues to receive the attention it deserves and help implement its finest recommendations
- Work with County Council, the Friends associations, and other interested partners in moving the Allegheny County parks system to the status of Excellence among national park systems.
- Generate resources to ensure the successful completion of deferred maintenance in our County Park System.
- Develop a cost analysis of park facilities.
