preservation issues attending the destruction of Maitland House in South Park.

In response to a question from Ms. Rea, Mr. Baechle indicated that the Council of Friends is part of the County, and that it therefore is not necessary to insist that they

secure their own insurance against any potential liability.

In response to a question from Mr. Finnerty, Mr. Baechle indicated that the County would maintain the outside of the building, and the Council of Friends would maintain the inside.
