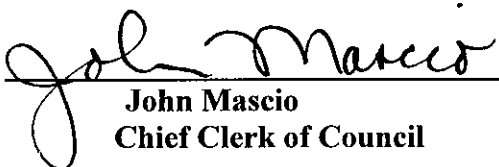

Dear Council Members:

Please find the attached resume of Dr. Lee Harrison, whom I am recommending for reappointment to the Allegheny County Board of Health.

The powers and duties of the Health Board are set out in Section 12011 of Act 315, Local Health Administration Law, as amended.
