Summary:

Mr. Fawcett pointed out that the Pittsburgh area currently has bridges named after Andy Warhol and Roberto Clemente, and that it is fitting to name a third after Rachel Carson because, like Warhol and Clemente, she had a worldwide affect on people. He said that they compliment each other. He said it is an honor to give recognition to a woman that had such a world wide impact in improving the world from an environmental perspective. Mr. Fawcett continued to speak about the life of Rachel Carson.

Ms. Watt said that she was very excited about naming the bridge after Rachel Carson. She said that Ms. Carson is someone that Allegheny County should be proud of. She said that Ms. Carson was born in Springdale, which is one of the communities that Ms. Watt

represents. She said she was a pioneer and she made a statement by not backing down from her beliefs. She said that she is an example for all women.

Mr. Gastgeb spoke in favor of the bill.

Esther Barazzone, President of Chatham College, addressed the committee. She pointed out that Rachel Carson was a graduate of Chatham College. She said that she is pleased and grateful for council's comments. She said that she speaks on behalf of the many people in attendance from Chatham College. She said that Ms. Carson is a very important person and it is appropriate that the county recognize her in this way. She said that a bridge is an appropriate honor since water moved Ms. Carson profoundly. She said that this makes a statement to the rest of the country that Pittsburgh is an environmental leader.

Ms. Frazier that she was pleased to support this effort, and that reaching out in this manner could make people view Pittsburgh in a different perspective.

Ms. Cleary thanked all that attended and said she too was excited about doing this.
