AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, authorizing Tristar Productions Inc. to use certain County-owned real and personal property in connection with filming a motion picture.

Whereas, Tristar Productions Inc. (hereinafter the "Production Company") is filming a motion picture in Allegheny County entitled "Happiest Season" (hereinafter the "Motion Picture"); and

Whereas, the Production Company has requested to use certain County-owned real property situated in and around Boyce Park and such other sites as mutually agreed and certain personalty owned by the County (collectively the "County Property") in connection with filming the Motion Picture; and

Whereas, the County of Allegheny (hereinafter the "County") has agreed to let the Production Company film the Motion Picture in and around Boyce Park and such other County locations as mutually agreed pursuant to a Location Agreement that will govern the Production Company's use of the County Property and will provide specific protections for the County; and

Whereas, the County deems it in the public interest to permit the Production Company to use the County Property in connection with filming the Motion Picture; and

Whereas, Article IV, Section 2(k) of the Allegheny County Home Rule Charter vests County Council with the power and duty by ordinance to lease or permit the use of County real and personal property.

The Council of the County of Allegheny hereby enacts as follows:

SECTION 1. Incorporation of the Preamble.

The provisions set forth in the Preamble to this Ordinance are incorporated by reference as set forth in their entirety herein.

SECTION 2. Authorization for the use of County Real and Personal Property.

A. Allegheny County Council hereby grants the Production Company the right to use the County Property in connection with filming the Motion

- Picture, pursuant to the terms of a location agreement to be entered into between the Production Company and the County; and
- B. The proper officers of the County are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the use of the County Property relating to the filming of the Motion Picture.
- SECTION 3. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Ordinance shall be determined to be unlawful, invalid, void or unenforceable, then that provision shall be considered severable from the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, which shall be in full force and effect.
- SECTION 4. <u>Repealer</u>. Any Resolution or Ordinance or part thereof conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance is hereby repealed so far as the same affects this Ordinance.

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION

The attached legislation would permit Tristar Productions Inc. to use certain County-owned real and personal property situated in and around Boyce Park and such other sites as mutually agreed in connection with filming a motion picture entitled "Happiest Season."

The tentative filming schedule for the motion picture in the region is January-March 2020. Specific filming dates on County Property will be established and mutually agreed upon pursuant to a Location Agreement that will govern the Production Company's use of the County Property. Tristar Productions Inc. will be required to provide insurance and indemnify the County against any claims, as well as to reimburse the County for its out-of-pocket costs.
