IV. Agenda Items

Ordinances

- An Ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, amending and supplementing the Administrative Code of Allegheny County, Article 207, entitled "New Board of Property Appeals Assessment and Review," §5-207.06, entitled "Rules and regulations for appeals," in order to establish a mechanism for electronic and/or regular mail filing of appeals.
 - <u>Sponsors:</u> Council Member Kress and Council Member Macey

At the request of the Chair, the clerk read the title of the bill and Mr. Kress explained the intent behind and objective of the bill.

Mr. Kress expressed a desire to amend the bill such that it only authorizes the electronic filing of assessment appeals, rather than to the submission of evidence electornically.

Mr. McKain noted that the adminstrative supports the use of technology in accordance

with applicable law and regulation, where appropriate, and noted that appropriate staff and other resources do currently exist to accomodate the provisions of this ordinance.

Mr. T indicated that he believes that the measure would provide additional utility for the public, and would likely streamile the process.

Mr. Montgomery expressed the support of BPAAR for the measure, and asked whether taxing bodies and/or representatives for filing parties would be able to file electronically. *Mr. T* indicated that they would, and he, *Mr. McKain* and *Mr. Majewski* discussed the mechanics of the filing process, and the potential to cut down on duplicate filings.

Mr. Finnerty asked if commercial properties would be eligible for electronic filing, and *Mr. T* indicated that they would.

Mr. McKain and *Mr. T* discussed the mechanism that exists for catching false or fraudulent appeals.

Mr. Finnerty and *Mr.* Majewski discussed the current website, noting that the existing content indicates which properties are subject to pending appeals.

Mr. Kress, Mr. T and Mr. Majewski discussed the other procedural options that can be exercised electronically.

Mr. Kress and *Mr.* Montgomery discussed the relative paucity of false or fraudulent appeals at the present time, with *Mr.* Montgomery noting that he is unaware of any criminal charges ever stemming from such a filing.

Mr. Finnerty and Mr. Kress discussed the content and impact of the amendment.

Mr. Montgomery, *Mr.* Majewski and *Mr.* McKain discussed the possibility of establishing an automatic notification to the taxing bodies when an appeal is filed electronically.

Mr. Kress moved to amend, *Mr.* Finnerty seconded, and the motion passed unanimously among the members present. **Amended and Affirmatively Recommended as Amended**
