

Legislation Text

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An Ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, authorizing the use of real property in the County's South Park by the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh, which includes the South Hills YMCA.

Whereas, The County of Allegheny is the owner of real property near the intersection Corrigan Drive

and Maple Springs Road in the County's South Park, known as the Dek Hockey Rink,

Whereas, The Department of Parks is requesting the use of the property in the County's South Park as a venue for Dek Hockey activities coordinated by the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh/South Hills YMCA,

Whereas, County Council recognizes that the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh/South Hills YMCA will continue to provide general clean up within the Dek Hockey Rink and the immediate area surrounding the venue,

Whereas, County Council recognizes the recreational and community service value provided to the County's residents through the availability of the activities coordinated by the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh/South Hills YMCA,

Whereas, Article IV, Section 2(k) of the Allegheny County Home rule Charter vests County Council with the power and duty by ordinance to lease or permit the use of County property.

The Council of the County of Allegheny hereby enacts as follows:

SECTION 1. <u>Incorporation of the Preamble</u>.

The provisions set forth in the preamble to this Ordinance are incorporated by reference as set forth in their entirety herein.

SECTION 2. <u>Authorization to permit the Use of County Real Property</u>.

County Council does hereby authorize the use of real property near the intersection of Corrigan Drive and Maple Springs Road in the County's South Park, known as the Dek Hockey Rink, as a venue for Dek Hockey activities coordinated by the YMCA of

Greater Pittsburgh/South Hills YMCA. The appropriate County officers and officials are authorized to take such action as is necessary to carry out the purposes of the authorization granted herein.

- SECTION 3. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Ordinance shall be determined to be unlawful, invalid, void or unenforceable, then that provision shall be considered severable from the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, which shall be in full force and effect.
- SECTION 4. <u>Repealer</u>. Any Resolution or Ordinance or part thereof conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance is hereby repealed so far as the same affects this Ordinance.
